Sec. 62-128. Solicitations on streets or public places.

It shall be unlawful for any person to solicit trade or customers or patronage for any business or purpose whatsoever on any sidewalk, street or public place within the city.

Sec. 62-129. Uninvited telephone solicitations.

- (a) It is hereby declared to be a nuisance and unlawful for any transient solicitor, peddler, hawker, itinerant merchant or vendor, not having been requested or invited to do so by the person called over the telephone, to call for the purpose of soliciting such person called to make a donation or to subscribe to or to advertise or to give or to pay money or other thing of value for any ticket, flag, tag, badge, flower, token, symbol, merchandise or publication or, for the purpose of carrying on such business, to hire, lease or occupy, either in whole or in part, a room, building or other structure for the exhibition or sale of such goods, wares and merchandise.
- (b) All violators of this section, upon conviction, shall be subject to the penalties provided in section 1-14
- (c) A transient solicitor, peddler, hawker, itinerant merchant or vendor within the meaning of this section, is defined as any person who engages in the vending or sale of merchandise at any place in this city temporarily and who does not intend to become or does not become a permanent merchant of such place and who, for the purpose of carrying on such business, hires, leases or occupies, either in whole or in part, a room, building or other structure for the exhibition or sale of such goods, wares and merchandise.
